

Dr. Luis Valente suggests self and peer assessment can help students to move away from

seeing teachers as the only sour ce of judgement about the quality of their learning, ther eby helping them to become more independent learners. Do y ou agree, and what are your experiences of this? He also notes that r esearch shows that self-assessment combined with peer assessment r educes the trend for 'friendship dependency', 'benefit of the dominat ors' and 'benefit of par asitism'. Does this match with your experiences? What do you think of assigning a per centage weight to individual assessment as part of the summative assessment related to collaborative work? Any other thoughts on Dr. Valente's suggestions?

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
